Fr. Louis' Corner

In preparation for Holy Week, as I wrote last week, the clergy of our diocese gathered on Thursday for the Chrism Mass. We gather that day for a day of recollection. We were led this day by the recently

retired bishop of Great Falls/Billings, Michael Warfel. He helped us to reflect on the promises that we made t our diaconate ordination. We make promises to celibacy, obedience and prayer. If you are wondering how the promise to celibacy affects the permanent deacons, they promise to not remarry if their wife passes

away. Celibacy means more than living chastely alone. It has to do with being available to serve. In our culture today many would consider it an odd way of life, however we know than very many of our celibate priests and deacons live very happy, fulfilled lives. Obedience for Catholic clergy is not blind obedience, its's not that easy, we must be willing to help the bishop do what is best for the diocese, and the pope for what is best for the universal church. We must be prayerful people who discern with the bishop what is best. You may notice that I didn't mention poverty, diocesan priests do not make that promise as religious order priests do, however we are called to live simply. Of course religious poverty is not the same as economic poverty which is an injustice that should be overcome so that everyone can live with the dignity that every human person deserves. Of course this is a very brief overview, it was a wonderful day of recollection and I feel very well prepared for our beautiful Holy Week journey!

Roland "Nick" Eckes 4th Degree Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship is available to students working towards an under graduate degree. All graduating seniors and above along with vocational, and seminariary will be eligible. No graduate school students may apply. One scholarship will be available this year in the amount of \$500.00. Donations from any other source will be accepted and added to increase this amount, the final amount may vary. The Faithful Navigator will appoint the scholarship committee. It will be composed of 4th degree Knights of the Father Adolph Pate Assembly #1291. The faithful navigator is automatically a member of the committee. A G.P.A. of 2.5 or higher along with financial need will be the basic criteria considered. An effort to choose only practicing Catholic students will be made along with sons and daughters of current members of the Knights of Columbus. Deadline will be April 15, 2024. The decision of the scholarship committee is final. Past recipients of this scholarship are not eligible.

Faith Formation News

Normally when we hear the word focus, we generally think of cameras. We like for things to be sharp and well-defined. With digital cameras, we can check immediately if they are. In our spiritual lives, we should want to keep our focus. Isaiah 50:7 gives a prophecy of the Messiah's unwavering determination to persevere in the excruciating task set before Him.. He "set His face like flint" and headed for Jerusalem. When Jesus headed for Jerusalem, and shared with the disciples what would happen to him, he was **focused**! He **knew** the adoration of the crowds on Palm Sunday wouldn't last, that in a few days they would turn against Him, and his friends would betray Him. Yet He kept going. There's the ultimate example of keeping your focus. The last weeks of Jesus' life are an intense and incredible study in discipline and focus. Let's make that focus OUR focus.
