

## Fr. Louis' Corner

Christ is Risen, Alleluia Alleluia! We have made it through another Lent, and if you are like me the best thing that you got out of this Lent is the greater understanding of just how much you need the grace and mercy of God and the salvation of our Lord Jesus Christ. In our Gospel readings for Easter we hear of the Holy Women disciples of Jesus coming to his tomb early on the first Easter. On Saturday night we hear Mark's account, in it there is a young man in a white robe, many consider to be an angel, however this young man naturally reminds us of the young man wearing nothing but a white robe who ran off naked in the Garden when he fled the arrest of Jesus abandoning his white garment in order to escape capture. On Sunday morning we hear John's account which tells us that Jesus' head covering, or napkin, was neatly folded. This was a sign that the master would return. The women diciples know Jesus and that he told them that He would rise from the dead, but in their despair they are going about the need for caring for his remains and ignore the signs they find at the tomb. Their faith was frail. How like them we are. We know that he suffered and died for us and rose on the third day, but we still despair. We still worry about how we are going to keep things in control. When what we really need to do is keep the faith and work in His grace, depending on His mercy.

## **Faith Formation News**

"HE IS RISEN! HE IS RISEN INDEED!" That's a fact. We are also left with a promise. He will return! That promise is found in John 20:7, where Jesus' burial wrappings are left in a disheveled pile, but the face covering, the "napkin," is left folded up neatly. Why this little detail? Jews of the time would of course have "napkins" since much eating was done with the hands. If the master of the house needed to leave the meal table temporarily, he would fold his napkin and lay it aside. This was a signal to the servants to not clear the table, but to wait until after he returned. If the "napkin" was wadded up and left, that was a signal to clear the table because the master was not going to return. And Jews of the time would recognize that little detail. The folded napkin in John's Gospel means that Jesus is coming back. Hallelujah!


