

An Update from Mrs. M

The eclipse on Mondau kicked off another exciting week here at St. Margaret's School. Teachers worked together to provide students with an engaging, educational experience school-wide. They used kinetic sand and participated in experiments that helped them understand the eclipse. Then, of course, they "sunglassed-up" and went outside to check it out firsthand.

On Monday and Tuesday, I attended a funding summit at CWC to learn more about the grant-writing process. I had the distinct privilege of sitting next to one of the brilliant minds in our parish who pointed out that there were "little seeds" of information that could bear fruit for us if I cultivate them. It was a good learning experience, and I was grateful for the opportunity in our communitu.

On another note, we're pursuing accreditation! Accreditation is a big undertaking, especially for a school our size, but we embark on the journey alongside the other five Catholic schools in Wyoming and under Kim Gorr's expert leadership, the Director of Catholic School Leadership for the Diocese of Cheyenne. Working with an agency that prioritizes Catholic identity along with academics and improvement excites me. The Western Catholic Educational Association's (WCEA) mission is "to advance quality Catholic education for all students in member schools and arch/dioceses through an accrediting process that promotes the primacy of faith formation, the rigor of educational excellence, and the vitality that comes through continuous school improvement." WCEA was established in 1962 and is the largest Catholic accrediting agency in the United States.

We're still looking for individuals who are knowledgeable about our faith and passionate about faith-based education. This doesn't just mean teachers! Kim Gorr, the Director of Catholic School Leadership for the Diocese of Cheyenne, and I are putting together a committee that will plan a sort of "Crash Course in the Catholic Faith," a professional development opportunity for non-Catholic teachers and staff in Wyoming Catholic schools. At times, many schools, like ours, are grateful to employ great educators who may not have a background in the Catholic faith, but are eager to participate in and reinforce our schools' unique Catholic identity. How do they do this meaningfully without the confidence that comes only with experience and background knowledge? This course aims to help with that. 


