


## An Update from Mrs. M

I noticed few yawns here and there on Tuesday. It takes everyone a minute to a just back into our routines after Spring Break, but we are ready to hit the ground running again. Students really start hitting turning points academically, and we plan lots of celebrations alongside testing and other end-of-the-year activities.

This year, our students are taking the WY-TOPP test. WY-TOPP is different from the other screening tools we use here at St. Margaret's School. The data may not be immediately actionable for teachers, but it does give us good information in order to grow. It also shows that we aren't scared of accountability, something that will work in our favor in the coming years when it comes to accreditation and the new Education Savings Account. We get to know and show what our students can do.

In other news, we've had the distinct pleasure of working with some really high-quality contractors as they complete the projects from the FEMA grant. The work continues. Exterior lighting is done; interior locks are underway; and exterior doors and access systems are on their way.

We also participated in an energy incentive program that allowed us to update all our interior bulbs to LED, thanks to volunteer and school alumnus Jim Hartman. We are proud to say that this project serves young people in our community as well because, under Mr. Hartman's supervision, Wind River Job Corps Electrical students will help him with the installation and gain valuable work-based learning experience.

And last, a project dear to my heart... Kim Gorr, the Director of Catholic School Leadership for the Diocese of Cheyenne, and I are putting together a committee that will plan a sort of "Crash Course in the Catholic Faith," a professional development opportunity for non-Catholic teachers and staff in Wyoming Catholic schools. At times, many schools, like ours, are grateful to employ great educators who may not have a background in the Catholic faith, but are eager to participate in and reinforce our schools' unique Catholic identity. How do they do this meaningfully without the confidence that comes only with experience and background knowledge? This course aims to help with that. 




#### Why Catholics believe in "life everlasting"

Today I want to follow up on what I wrote last Sunday about the folded napkin mentioned in the Gospel of St. John. Now - - - if you think that this custom is some 2,000-year-old relic of etiquette, think again. My father-in-law was a Navy Captain. At officers mess, if duty called him away from the dinner table, he would fold his napkin and set it on his chair. That was a signal that he would return! When he was done with his meal he would simply wad up the napkin and leave it on the table. This was the signal that he was done and would not return to the table. My father-in-law continued this ritual for the rest of his life. I personally witnessed him doing this in restaurants. The folded napkin meant that he was going to return to the table. The folded napkin in John's Gospel means that Jesus will return. What a wonderful promise!
