St. Paul tells us of his peace and that Jesus came to preach that peace to those who are far off and near. Scholars tell us that this was for the benefit of Jews and Gentiles in St. Paul’s time, so that they could have unity. It is always important for us to understand what the scriptures are telling us today. I am reminded that Jesus’ peace is an invitation to everyone, not just to those who faithfully practice. Jesus reacts with compassion for the crowd when he and his disciples are looking for a quiet place to rest and pray. He is present for those in need. I need to respond like Jesus and not the way the shepherds that Jeremiah refers to do. How about you?
