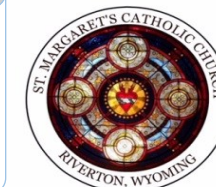

Fr. Louis' Corner

We hear from St. James in our second reading this we of the differences of the Wisdom from above, God's Wisdom, and wisdom that comes from the world. Being aware of and living in God's Wisdom comes from a genuine relationship with our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Jealousy and all of the other awful things that St. James lists comes from human wisdom: our selfish human desires. In our Gospel reading Jesus is teaching His disciples on the way to Capernaum that he must be handed over to men and suffer and die as is prophesied in our first reading from the Book of Wisdom. They do not understand the Wisdom from above that is driving Jesus' teaching, so they fall into a discussion of who is the greatest, their minds cannot handle this teaching; they are too entrenched in the world. Jesus knows this so he does not rail at them; he does not even interrupt their conversation. When they arrive at the house in Capernaum He asks them what they were talking about on the way. They are clearly starting to get Jesus teaching because they remain silent in response to His question. Once again Jesus does not berate them; He reiterates His teaching that if they wish to be the greatest they must humble themselves like a little child, taking a child in His arms to make the point. Jesus understands our nature that we want reward. He is telling us to eschew the rewards of earth so that we can bask in the rewards of heaven.
