



Fr. Eugene's Corner

Once more, it is a privilege and grace to behold the beauty of a new Sunday. We are grateful to God for this opportunity to experience His love. The sense of sight receives special attention in the human body. This is

essential because, without proper vision or sight, an individual will grope in darkness. Thus, seeing or sight is important to the existential living of a person; hence the popular maxim, "Your eyes, your future." In the Gospel reading today, we see how Jesus Christ heals the blind beggar named Bartimaeus. This blind man had heard about Jesus but could not see Him because he was blind. Blindness is a distortion of seeing and a hin-

drance to knowing Jesus Christ clearly and convincingly. Blindness can serve as an obstacle to faith, often filling a person with fear. Finally, Jesus cured Bartimaeus of his blindness. Friends in Christ, as we gradually approach the end of the liturgical calendar, there is a need for us all to call on the Lord Jesus to heal us of our individual blindness. Those things that distort or distract us from knowing Jesus closely and convincingly act as blindness to us. We need the help of God to heal us of our blindness. Bartimaeus called out to Jesus for help and received his healing. Let us also call out to Jesus for our own healing. The power of sight cannot be underestimated. Christians need to be insightful to worship God in truth and spirit. As Scripture reminds us, "The eyes of the Lord are in every place, keeping watch on the evil and the good" (Proverbs 15:3). We must remain aware and vigilant, for "we walk by faith, not by sight" (2 Corinthians 5:7). With the power of sight, we will come to see and know God better, serve Him better, and then render help to those who are in need. As we pray, let us echo the words of Psalm 119:18: "Open my eyes that I may see wonderful things in your law." May God's Word find a place in us. Amen.
