When we hear a Gospel passage it is important that we understand it in context. That is especially true for our Gospel passage this week from St. Mark. It comes from the second half of the thirteenth chapter and begins by telling us about what will happen after the tribulation. So clearly, at the very least, we need to know what that tribulation is. I would like to encourage you to spend time with the whole thirteenth chapter today,. This chapter is the longest discourse in St. Mark's Gospel with warnings and instructions about the end times. Jesus is attempting to convey in human terms that which is by its very nature mysterious to us. In modern scripture study we recognize this chapter to be a different kind of literature than the rest of Mark's Gospel. It is apocalyptic literature. It is even referred to as the little apocalypse, the Book of Revelation is called the great apocalypse. Apocalyptic literature is used in times of great suffering to help us to understand our suffering and more importantly to give us hope for the reward to come as we live through our suffering. We know of God's mercy for those who are willing to repent. Let us all watch for the second coming of our Savior in the sure and certain hope of his merciful love for us.

## **Faith Formation News**

I'm still thinking about the book of Ezekiel. It's one of the longest books in the Bible and also among the most quoted. Chapter 37 contains the famous prophecy of the valley of dry bones. Regis Martin describes the vision this way: "It is a stirring passage in which God assures Ezekiel that, yes, these bones shall live, but not without a great deal of purifying fire to burn away all that stands athwart the covenant so many had abandoned. Thus will the apostasy and sin of Israel serve to validate the presiding theme set out by Ezekiel, which is that of ruin followed by restoration." Thank you, Regis Martin.

There can be little doubt (at least in my humble opinion) that our nation is in dire need of restoration. It is up to each of us and all of us to bring that about, so that the dry bones of this nation's faith might take on flesh.
