# **Eighth Sunday In Ordinary Time** March 2, 2025



Fr. Louis' Corner We are blessed to have had this opportunity to be fed by the sermon on the plain for these three week leading up to Lent. This Sunday we hear parables about leadership, specifically about how a disciple of Jesus should lead others to also be disciples of Jesus. He then goes on to talk about the fruit that trees produce. A well cultivated

tree has a better opportunity to produce good fruit than one that is neglected. Just as a person has a better opportunity to be a good disciple of Jesus when they have been accompanied by good teachers of the faith. We do not hear the last few verses of the sermon. In those verses Jesus tells us about the importance of building our homes on solid rock foundation. Just as we should build our lives on the foundations of the faith that Jesus has taught us. When we only partially build our lives around Jesus' teaching, we are in danger of being swept away from Jesus by those other concerns just like a home built on sand can be washed away by a flood.



Heading toward the season of Lent, I am drawn back to a Gospel reading where Jesus asks the disciples "Who do you say that I am?" Peter answers in a moment of clarity, cor-

rectly, by identifying Jesus as the Son of God; the long-awaited Messiah. If our faith is being properly formed, Peter's answer should be our answer. But there's another side to this! Who do people say that YOU are? "It seems all God wants are useable instruments who will carry the mystery, the weight of glory and the burden of sin simultaneously, who can bear the darkness and the light, who can hold the paradox of incarnation—flesh and spirit, human and divine, joy and suffering—at the same time, just as Jesus did." (Richard Rohr) Just as Christ literally bore the marks of passion on His body, we are to bear the marks of what it means to be a Christian in the way we live.
