



This Sunday we will celebrate the third Scrutiny here at St Margarets. So Fr. Louis' Corner once again we will have different sets of readings at our Masses. For the Masses where we do not celebrate the Scrutiny we will hear of the woman caught in adultery by the scribes and Pharisees. They are clearly trying to trap Jesus with what they see as a major conflict

between his teaching and the teaching of the law of Moses. We well know that Jesus' opponents never outwit him. He responds to their questions about the possible execution of the woman with silence. He bends down and writes on the ground;. He straitens up and states "Let he who is without sin cast the first stone." They leave one by one, starting with the elders. Jesus does not condemn; he teaches repentance, mercy and love. The Gospel reading for the Scrutiny is the account of Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead. Jesus does not hurry back to Bethany when He hears the news of Lazarus being near death, Rather He waits so that there will be no doubt that He has the power of God working through Him. He prays to His Father, not because He needs help, but because He wants the crowd to know that He is indeed sent by God.
