

Fr. Louis' Corner

In our Gospel this week we get a lesson on prayer from Jesus. One of His disciples asks Jesus to teach them how to pray. He begins by telling them to pray to the Father. Luke's version of the Our Father is different from Matthew's. Which is the one that we are all so familiar with, I dare say that the vast majority of Christians world wide

know it by heart from a young age. But do we really pay attention to what we are saying when we pray it? I invite you to spend some time with both versions of it. It is important that we contemplate what we are praying about. We praise the Lord, then we acknowledge what the Lord does for us, then we ask for stuff. Then we claim to forgive others. Jesus goes on encouraging us to persevere in prayer with a parable about a bothersome neighbor. He points out that we imperfect people will help when we are asked for it and how much more will our Heavenly Father in His goodness grant our consistent requests.

Psalm One: "Blessed is the one who does not walk in step with the wicked or stand in the way that sinners take or sit in the company of mockers, 2 but whose delight is in the law of the Lord, and who meditates on his law day and night. 3 That person is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither—whatever they do prospers. 4 Not so the wicked! They are like chaff that the wind blows away." In 1 Corinthians 10:11, Saint Paul wrote that the Psalms were written for our instruction. How does this very first Psalm instruct you? Are you blessed in the way this Psalm describes? Do you just keep quiet with words and demeanor, and try to just "get along" with a corrupt culture? Or do you resemble verse one? Jesus rejected evil. We would do well to do the same.
