We aim to help each student know who they are in Christ and live in a way that reflects His love. From behavior response to curriculum, we seek to place Jesus at the center of all we do.
- **3. Animated by Communion and Community:** We are one Body in Christ. Whether it's gathering for Mass, praying as a staff, or building partnerships with families, we are intentional about creating a school culture that fosters relationships rooted in love, respect, and faith.
- **4. Imbued with a Catholic Worldview:** Our faith isn't just a subject; it's a lens through which we view all learning and life. We strive to infuse each subject, lesson, and school event with the truth, beauty, and goodness of our Catholic faith, helping students see the world through God's eyes.
- **5. Sustained by Gospel Witness:** The most powerful way we teach is by example, so adults in our school try to live our faith out loud by modeling prayer, service, and virtue in everyday moments. When students see authentic witness, they are drawn closer to Christ themselves.

These marks are the heartbeat of our school. We aim to use principles like these to guide how we plan, teach, pray, and serve. As we begin this school year, we're grateful to partner with you in this beautiful mission.





Fr. Eugene's Corner

The quest for satisfaction and deeper fulfillment is one that has led believers into a deeper walk with God. The various existential events of life also prompt believers to demonstrate their faith in those moments when life seems incomprehensible. Today, faith and action are remembered as twin

pillars that help navigate the difficulties of daily life. The Penny Catechism defines faith as a supernatural gift from God that allows belief without doubt in what God has revealed. Hebrews 11:1 defines faith as the assurance of things hoped for and the conviction of things not seen. Faith is needed to be victorious, steadfast, and

hopeful in life's journey. Those considered heroes of faith, such as Abraham and Sarah, faced real challenges, yet they were victorious and received God's blessing through their faith. Hebrews 11:6 states, "And without faith it is impossible to please him, for whoever would draw near to God must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him." Faith requires action. Faith must be shown in the face of adversity and uncertainty, according to James 2:17: "So also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead." The path to the heavenly kingdom is not always easy; it's a path that requires both faith and action. The heroes of faith inspire and motivate believers. Faith is essential to be a good servant, as Titus 3:8 reminds: "The saying is trustworthy, and I want you to insist on these things, so that those who have believed in God may be careful to devote themselves to good works.
