This year, nine families and seventeen children were approved for assistance, and we're still about \$1,000 short, not including unexpected needs that may arise this school year or the tuition needs for next fall (the Angel Fund has never been depleted totally; if we raise \$1,000 more, it will be depleted this school year.)

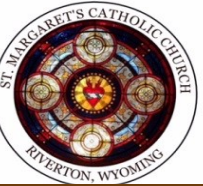

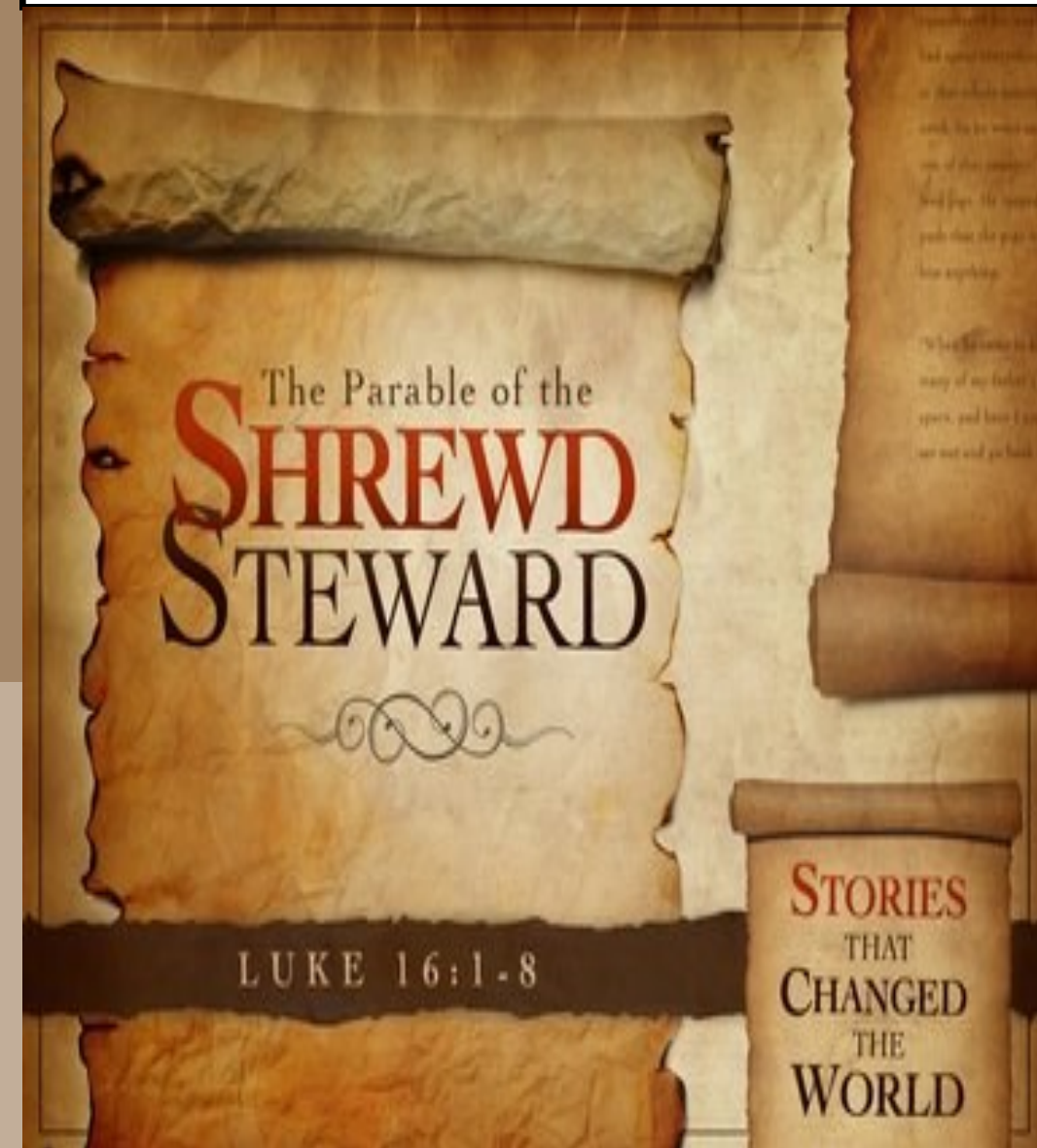

This week we hear the parable of the dishonest steward. We can be confused by this if we think that the rich man represents God. The rich man tells the steward that he can no longer be his steward because he has squandered his property, but commended him for being prudent when he quickly reduced the debt that the tenants owed. We can spend time wondering at the motivations of these two men, but we are better served to look to what Jesus is teaching from that story. He is trying to get us see that people are prudent about earthly things, or what he calls dishonest wealth. As children of the light we should be all the more prudent about what really matters. He tells us that we should use our worldly wealth as is needed, but to be more concerned about what really matters. We should use our earthly goods, but not at the expense of heavenly reward. We do not want any earthly thing to become our master. God should be our only master.

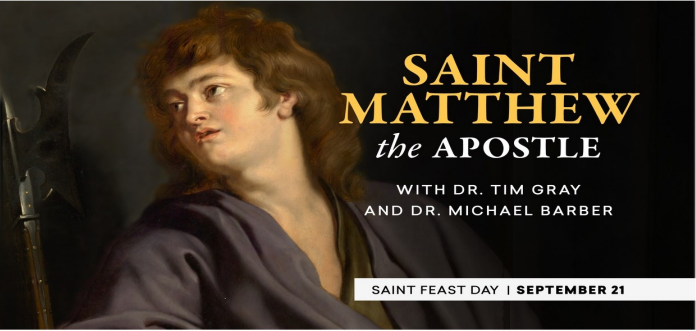

54 Day Rosary Novena for Our Nation concludes Tuesday, October 7 (Our Lady of the Rosary), but Sunday, October 5th will be the National Rosary Coast to Coast. St. Margaret’s Parish will join thousands of people across our nation and around the world (50+ countries) all praying the Rosary on Sunday, Oct. 5th at the same time, 2:00 Mountain Time. Please come at about 1:50 for a special gift to Our Blessed Mother, and asking for Her intercession.

The Rosary will be proceeded with Consecration to Mary’s Immaculate Heart by which Father will entrust all of us (Parish and Mission), to Mary’s protection and tender care. Faith Formation News

I recently had an illuminating experience with James 4:4: “You adulterous people! Do you not know that friendship with the world is enmity with God? Therefore, whoever wishes to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God.” Why does James call his audience “adulterous people”? Given context and common sense , James accused them not of physical adultery, but spiritual adultery. Spiritual adultery is essentially the same as idolatry: worshiping anything other than God. When we are referring to our tendency to turn away from God, spiritual adultery may be a better term for us to use. “Idolatry” doesn’t sting us like it should, partly because our hearts are hard, but also because idols seem like such a distant reality to our culture. As Christianity Today put it: “*In reality all sin is spiritual adultery—unfaithfulness to the lover of our soul.*”
