This year, nine families and seventeen children were approved for assistance, and we're still about \$1,000 short, not including unexpected needs that may arise this school year or the tuition needs for next fall (the Angel Fund has never been depleted totally; if we raise \$1,000 more, it will be depleted this school year.)

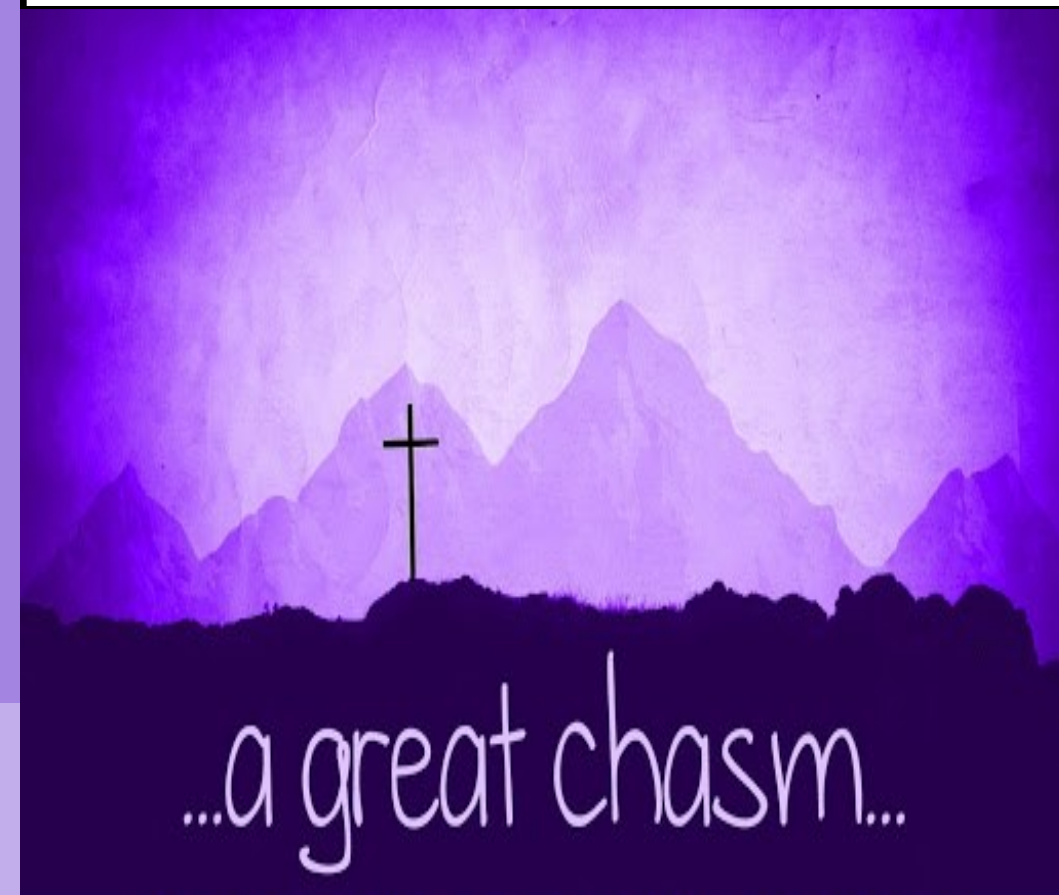

The Rich man and Lazarus: we hear of them at our Mass this weekend. Lazarus is poor: disgustingly so. It would have been hard for the rich man to even recognize his dignity. Indeed he does not, he steps over or around him ignoring the dogs that come and lick Lazarus’s wounds. When we see someone in Lazarus’s situation can we recognize their dignity? I often hear people say, “what are you going to say to Jesus on judgement day?” To those doing bad things. If we pay attention to this parable we can see that it will be too late. Your testimony on judgement day is happening right now. When we ignore someone like Lazarus we are testifying against ourselves. When we help them we are giving testimony that will help us on the last day. Jesus came and rose from the dead, are we going to listen to him?

St. Margaret’s Parish will join thousands of people across our nation and around the world (50+ countries) all praying the Rosary on Sunday, Oct. 5th at the same time, 2:00 Mountain Time. Please come at about 1:50 for a special gift to Our Blessed Mother, and asking for Her intercession.

The Rosary will be proceeded with Consecration to Mary’s Immaculate Heart by which Father will entrust all of us (Parish and Mission), to Mary’s protection and tender care. Faith Formation News

When in the corporate world, I identified four stages of growth #1: the unconscious incompetent. Those folks don’t even realize that they’re getting things wrong or why. #2: the conscious incompetent. These folks have grown to the point that they realize that they’re “getting it wrong.” #3: the conscious competent. These folks are now “getting it right.” but it takes a lot of hard work and hard thinking. Finally, #4: the unconscious competent. These folks “have it together” to the point where they “do the right thing” without stopping to think about it. In order to grow further, it is necessary to cycle back to step #1 - - - but on a higher plane. This 4-step process is how we grow: in our faith, our wisdom, our knowledge, and our discernment. By growing and constantly cycling back to step #1, we become, as Jesus recommends, “like little children.”
