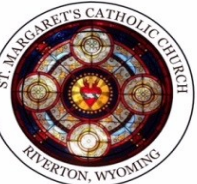

Fr. Louis' Corner

In the verses leading up to our Gospel reading this week, Jesus tells His disciples that anyone who wants to follow Him must take up his or her cross. We come to accept the little inconveniences in life as the little crosses that we bear. But just imagine what it was like for the disciples of Jesus' time to hear that. Taking up a cross was the most cruel and humiliating form of execution. It would be like saying to us that we should put a hangman's noose around our neck to make it easier for a lynch mob of enemies of the church to hang us. Jesus means that we must be willing not only to die for Him; we must be willing to die the most ignominious death imaginable. He then tells them that anyone who loves family more than Him is not worthy of Him. Family ties were then and still are the most important relationships known to humans, but that is not true, the most important relationship known to humans is the relationship with God. Jesus is telling us that we should put nothing before him in our lives. St. Paul reminds us that through our baptism we have died with Christ and are buried with Him so that we now can be raised with Him. These trials that we go through here on earth are much more than repaid by that reality!

Faith Formation News

I want to return today to a topic about which I recently wrote: the topic of idolatry and how idolatry is defined. In that post, I used Saint Paul's definition of idolatry as greed. Greed - - - not desire! The difference between desire and greed is like the difference between a camp stove and a raging inferno burning down your house. Simple desire is constructive. It motivates us to work and to be productive; it's what I have always referred to as "creative discontent." Proverbs 16:26 --- "The appetite of workers works for them." Greed, on the other hand, is dangerous and destructive. It is desire out of control. It is the condition that puts something - - - anything - - - ahead of God, even if only for a short while. Everyday greed, then, is nothing less than an attack on the very nature and character of God. No wonder Saint Paul warns so sternly against it!
